

I enjoy the lights of Christmas – especially in my home. I love the early mornings with the Christmas lights on. I'm thankful for the Church's Advent Devotional – each day shares a different prospective from someone in our church family. Special thanks to all the writers – I appreciate you. Remember to greet others with "*Merry Christmas*" – it puts a smile on many faces!

December and Christmas is REASON FOR EXTRA COOKIES! This is an old recipe – but makes a delicious cookie:

ORANGE COOKIES

³/4 Cup Butter2 Beaten Eggs1 Cup Sugar¹/4 tsp. SaltBeat all together until well combined – maybe four minutes on a higher speed in yourmixer.

Dissolve ½ tsp. Baking Soda in ¾ Cup Orange Juice 1 Tbsp. – Orange Zest 2 ½ Cups Flour Add the orange juice mixture & the orange zest – mix well Add the flour and mix until combined.

Drop onto a greased cookie sheet (or use parchment paper) – bake at 350 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes. Allow to cool.

Icing:

3 Tbsp. Butter ¹/₄ Cup Orange Juice 2 Cups Powdered Sugar Combine all and icing the cookies! 2 Cups Powdered Sugar


