## ramblings & recipes

**Welcome June** – I am so ready for May and its rain to leave town! I hope June brings us sunshine, blue skies, warm days (and nights) – weather that makes us want to be outside. Weather that brings out shorts (or capris), sandals and sunglasses!

Remember that Father's Day is June 15<sup>th</sup>. Be thankful and thank you Dad if he is still on the earth. Cherish the memories of your Dad if he is now living in heaven. I remember, when I was a child, making cookies for my Dad for Father's Day – I'm not sure if they were made correctly and/or if they were good – but he ate them! My Dad could eat any cookie if he could dunk it in his coffee.

Here is a wonderful cut-out cookie recipe.

#### **Cutout Cookies**

½ Cup Buttermilk 1½ Cups Sugar

1 Cup Butter2 Eggs1 teaspoon Baking Soda2 teaspoons Baking Powder

5 Cups Flour 1 teaspoon Vanilla

Combine butter, sugar, eggs and vanilla. (Use your mixer) Stir in the buttermilk. Add the dry ingredients. Chill dough if it is too soft to roll. Roll on a floured table or board. Do not roll too thin if you like a nice puffy cookie. Use your favorite cookie cutter or a cutter that is applicable to your occasion.

Bake at 375 degrees on a greased cookie sheet for 8 minutes or till set – do NOT bake until brown.

Allow to cool completely and frost with the following frosting.

#### Sugar Cookie Frosting

1 pound powdered sugar ½ cup milk

1 cup butter 1 teaspoon vanilla

1 Tablespoon flour dash of salt

½ teaspoon cream of tartar

Mix well (use your mixer) the butter, milk and vanilla. Add the dry ingredients and beat until fluffy. You will probably want to add coloring to this icing. Spread or decorate the cookies.

These keep nicely in the freezer in an airtight container.
