
A Note of Thanks...

THANKSGIVING!

We have so much to be thankful for. Make a list - ten things that you are most thankful for - read them every day until Thanksgiving! I enjoy the smells of preparing Thanksgiving treats and dinner. Here are two recipes you might enjoy.

Bacon & Ham Bake

1 – 9 inch unbaked pie shell 6 slices bacon, fried & crumbled

1 1/2 Cups Half & Half

2 Whole Eggs + 2 Egg Yolks

1 tsp. Salt

1 Cup Shredded Swiss Cheese

1 Cup Diced Ham

Line the bottom of the pie shell with the cheese.

Mix the eggs well - using a whisk or fork - add all the other ingredients and pour over the cheese in the pie shell.

Bake 1 hour, or until mixture is firm (knife in the center comes out clean) at 375 degrees.

Pumpkin Bars

4 Eggs – Beaten 1 Cup Vegetable Oil

2 Cups Sugar

1 Cup Pumpkin

½ tsp. Salt

2 tsp. Cinnamon 1 tsp. Baking Soda 1 tsp. Baking Powder 1 Cup Nuts or Raisins

2 Cups Flour

Combine all ingredients. Mix well and pour into a greased and floured cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for 20 to 25 minutes - do not overbake.

FROSTING:

3 oz Cream Cheese 34 Cup Powdered Sugar 1 Tbsp. Milk - maybe a little more

6 Tbsp. Butter 1 tsp. Vanilla

MIX ALL WELL.
