

RAMBLINGS & RECIPES

Preparing a page for the February 2026 "Contact"! I'm glad we are getting to February – although it could be similar to January – we are closer to Spring!

It seemed so different without going to Sunday School and Church today – it was a good idea to cancel – but I certainly missed getting together with my Church Family! Snow days are good days to cook and bake – I hope you made something good to eat. Food made in the oven makes your house smell so good and the oven heat helps to warm your kitchen.

I'm sharing two of my favorite cookie recipes.

Chocolate Chip Cookies

2 1/2 Cups Flour	1 (4 oz. pkg.) Instant Vanilla Pudding
1 tsp. Baking Soda	1 tsp. Vanilla
1 Cup Butter or Margarine	2 Eggs
3/4 Cup Firmly Packed Brown Sugar	1/4 Cup White Sugar
1 Bag (12 oz.) Chocolate Chips	

Add Baking Soda to Flour and set aside.

Use your mixer to combine butter, sugars, pudding and vanilla. Beat until smooth and creamy. Beat in eggs – one at a time. Gradually add the flour mixture until mixed well. Fold in the chocolate chips by hand.

Roll into balls, place on cookie sheet and bake at 350 for 10 minutes – do not overbake. Allow to set on cookie sheet a few minutes before placing on cooling rack.

Pat Weaver gave me the following recipe in 1987!!

Peanut Butter Cup Cookies

1/2 Cup Butter	3/4 tsp. Baking Soda
1/2 Cup Peanut Butter	1/2 tsp. Salt
1/2 Cup White Sugar	1 Egg
1/2 Cup Brown Sugar	Miniature Reese Cups (48)
1/2 tsp. Vanilla	
1 1/4 Cups Flour	

Cream butter, peanut butter and sugars. Beat in egg and vanilla. Add flour with salt and soda. Shape dough into 1 inch balls (you can use a small scoop) and place in ungreased small muffin tins.

Bake at 375 for 8 minutes. Remove from the oven and press Reese cups into center until only the top shows. Cool 10 minutes before removing from the pans!




FAMILY FUN NIGHT -A family fun night is being planned for February 7th, 2026 from 4-7 with life size games, regular games and food.

- red & pink construction paper
- markers — green, black
- glue or glue stick



- ♥ Fold card in half
- ♥ Cut 3 hearts from colored paper. Make them about 1 inch high.
- ♥ Glue the hearts on the left side, overlap a little.
- ♥ Use marker to make "stems" from the hearts — they'll look like a bouquet of flowers.
- ♥ On the right side print a message or a verse, such as "Jesus Loves You."


